

Have you been convicted of more than 3 unrelated felonies or high court misdemeanors?*



*High Court Misdemeanors are treated as felonies under Michigan's expungement law as they are punishable by more than 1 year in prison.

*Convictions that arise from the same incident and occur within 24 hours of each other may be treated as one criminal offense under the "One Bad Night" clause.

Wait periods triggered by whichever occurs last:

- · Imposition of sentence.
- · Discharge from probation.
- Discharge from parole.
- · Completion of any term of imprisonment.

Are any of your offenses excluded under MI's Clean Slate Act?

- All non-first violation DUI offenses.
- · Any offense punishable by life.
- Traffic offenses causing injury or death.
- Any traffic offenses committed by a person with a CDL while operating a commercial vehicle.
- · Child abuse 1st or 2nd
- Human trafficking.
- Terrorism.
- Felony DV if priors.
- CSC 1st, 2nd, or 3rd.
- CSC 4th if committed on or after January 12, 2015.
